

Vision Statement

Robert Morgan Educational Center believes that all students should have the opportunity to enroll in Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Students will be encouraged to work to the highest level of their potential in a supportive environment.

Selection Criteria

Eligibility for enrollment in AP courses is determined using the following criteria:

- Completion of prerequisite courses.
 - **Grade of A or B in Honors/Advanced World History**
 - **Grade of A or B in Honors/Advanced Language Arts**
- Passed FSA ELA Reading/Math/EOC in the respective content area.
- Excellent school attendance – no more than 10 absences.

AP Contract

An AP contract must be signed prior to registering or beginning an AP course. The contract is designed to inform current social studies and language arts teachers, students and parents of the specific requirements and expectations of the program.

Course Description:

AP World History is designed to be the equivalent of a two semester introductory college or university world history course. In AP World History students investigate significant events, individuals, developments, and processes in six historical periods from approximately 8000 B.C.E. to the present. Students develop and use the same skills, practices, and methods employed by historians: analyzing primary and secondary sources; developing historical arguments; making historical comparisons; and utilizing reasoning about contextualization, causation, and continuity and change over time. The course provides five themes that students explore throughout the course in order to make connections among historical developments in different times and places: interaction between humans and the environment; development and interaction of cultures; state building, expansion, and conflict; creation, expansion, and interaction of economic systems; and development and transformation of social structures. Support for Students

Robert Morgan Educational Center will provide a variety of resources to support students in AP courses. These resources include:

- Peer tutors
- Encouragement for students to form formal study groups
- Counseling
- Test taking strategies
- Guide on how to succeed in AP World History

The Exam

Since the culminating assessment for an AP course is the AP Examination, all students are expected to sit for the examination in May. **Students who do not take the AP exam will be subject to a financial obligation covering the cost of the exam (\$96) plus a return fee of \$15.**

Students who choose an AP course must be highly motivated, willing to do outside reading, research and writing, and able to undertake supplemental work on their own initiative. **This courses also requires summer reading, writing assignments and additional cost.** Instructors will need to move very intensively through a tremendous amount of material to prepare students appropriately. Therefore, it is imperative that students attend class every day. If a student must be absent, it is the responsibility of the student to find out what work was missed and to complete the assignments in the designated time frame.

Since an AP course is a college-level class that may result in a student earning college credit, students must be certain they are ready to meet the challenges of a college curriculum. They must be organized and self-disciplined, with above average reading and writing skills. Learning is only successful when students are actively engaged in the process; therefore, what they achieve will depend on their personal commitment and involvement.

Required Summer Assignment:

AP World History has a required summer assignment that is due within the first three days of school. Students **MUST** contact the teacher – Mrs. Admire via email at rladmire@dadeschools.net - between May 17th through June 1st in order to gain access to the summer assignment.
