**Grad Bash 2020 Dress Code & Policies (Revised 2-6-20)**  
**Friday, April 3, 2020**

**OK**

- Jeans, pants, leggings that are not torn or frayed
- Shorts that are knee-length
- Casual blouses and tops, all shirts must have sleeves
- Casual pants (including khakis and jeans), secured at waist
- Shirts with sleeves (golf/polo, dress shirts and t-shirts) are ok
- Comfortable shoes, all shoes must be closed-toe and closed-heel. No crocs or sandals.
- Purses no larger than 8.5" x 5.5" (size of a half sheet of notebook paper)
- Camera and cell phones
- Fanny Packs
- Drawstring backpacks (within the 14" x 18" size requirement)
- Hats

**UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE\*/NOT OK\***

- Backpacks of any size, type or style, briefcases, camera bags, tote bags and oversized purses larger than 8.5" x 5.5" (size of a half sheet of notebook paper) (does not apply to chaperones)
- Accessories that may be used as weapons (chains, spiked collars or belts, wallets, sharp objects, jewelry, pendants or charms larger than 2 inches)
- Clothing with any tears, frays, or holes.
- Clothing with language or graphics that are obscene, offensive or suggestive of sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related messaging

- Gang paraphernalia, jewelry, tattoos, clothing or other insignias which display, suggest or provoke violence.
- Extremely revealing clothing including: tank tops, bathing suit tops or bottoms, or see-through clothing of any kind
- Clothing that is too tight or exposes excessive portions of the skin, or revealing clothing that may be viewed as inappropriate at a school function (i.e. tops that bare the midriff or sides even when arms are extended above the head, see-through clothing, etc.)
- Jerseys of any type
- Guys may not wear tank tops or undershirts
- Tank tops or off-the-shoulder shirts of any kind
- Dresses or skirts
- Visible undergarments
- Clothing or accessories with high school name, mascot or logos
- High school jerseys or other attire displaying high school name/letters or mascot
- Clothing affiliated with any school, sports team, group, club, etc. (ex: letterman jackets, clothing with school logos, etc.)
- Clothing or accessories with area codes
- Spandex body suits or shorts
- Weapons, knives, laser pointers and chemical irritants of any kind
- Over-the-counter medications; tobacco or tobacco related products such as lighters, matches, pipes, etc.; and alcohol or any controlled substance
- Any containers with fluids of any kind; this includes water, any drinks and perfumes
- Aerosol cans/bottles of any type
- Guys and girls may not wear Basketball Shorts of any kind
- Matching or like attire among multiple students

- No blankets may be brought on the bus or into the park
- Small neck pillows are allowed for the bus ride; but not full-sized pillows
- All food/beverages to be brought on the bus must be factory sealed (no sandwiches or home-made items). We will be stopping in a rest-stop for snacks, and dinner is provided in the parks.
- *No over the counter medications are permitted. If you need to bring prescription medication it must be in a bottle prescribed to you with your legal name on it. You may only bring the exact dosage you will need for the duration of the field trip. A chaperone can carry the medication inside for you. If you require an EpiPen, inhaler, insulin, etc., this should be indicated on your field trip parent permission form. Ms. Castellanos, Student Activities Director, must be notified in advance.*
